NOTES FROM THE CHAIR

I have been attending various funding groups in the hope of raising cash to help to run a publicity campaign throughout the county and also to help groups with rent for accommodation now that Ty'r Binwydden is not able to offer additional rooms.

We have prepared a coloured poster advertising our aims and interest groups and the Library Service has very kindly distributed this throughout the county.
