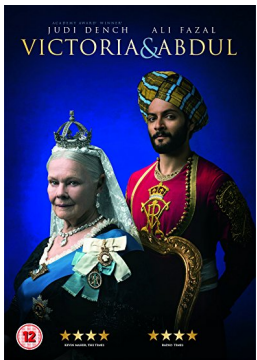
Donald Sutherland Kate Nelligan
